Have fire safety or ventilation been considered in the new area?	As discussed at each consultation session and highlighted within the consultation booklet, the plan is to create a short to medium-term capacity increase, whilst also developing medium to long-term plans with the school and relevant partners.
			The short-term plan is currently in development in consultation with senior leaders within the school and with the involvement of Technical and Health and Safety teams, as well as Education. This plan, should the proposal proceed, will create additional capacity within all phases, whilst also relocating Post 16 provision inclusive of 3 classrooms, a common room, life skills room, toilets and hygiene facilities.
			The aim in the short-term will be to reinstate the specialist areas which are currently accommodating learners, with a view to creating further additionally in the medium to long-term. The aim is to reconfigure the existing learning environment to meet the needs of both staff and pupils in the short-term, whilst developing the medium to long-term growth strategy.
			Yes, fire safety and ventilation are part of the design development phase and associated processes. The
