Blaenau Gwent	No	DPO comments – in the event that the Council chooses to explore the option of mandating CCTV I would proceed very cautiously as this will result in Blaenau Gwent potentially taking on a shared responsibility for the CCTV system and its use. This would mean that should there be any breaches or inappropriate disclosures of information or footage (e.g. footage put up on Facebook, Youtube etc) the Council would be held jointly liable. We would also potentially be responsible for ensuring correct security procedures, training and policies were in place. Consequently, as the Data Protection Officer for the Council I feel that it is less risk for the council to NOT mandate this currently.

Welsh Government	N/A	The guidance was discretionary but it was recommended that local authorities were data controllers as otherwise individuals and operators would need to register with ICO and it would be really difficult to control. It also gives the LA more control over the data when there are complaints. The guidance was aimed at getting consistency across Wales, but as only discretionary you could implement your own policy.
