In the area of Energy, support has been secured through a number of sources in order to undertake the development phases of the programme of projects and develop business cases. Capital investment will be required in order to install the infrastructure. Funding sources such as prudential borrowing will be investigated. For digital projects, investment has already been secured through UK government to install full fibre throughout the Borough but with technology advancing at a rapid pace we need to maintain momentum in technology development to support delivery of Council services in the future.

The projects being developed are such that they would likely be of Invest to save in nature and have the potential to generate revenue savings and potential future income opportunities. Being commercial opportunities there may be potential for joint ventures with commercial partners being secured to invest in projects.
