1. Purpose of the Report

The purpose of the report is to seek Council's approval for continuation of the current arrangements in relation to the appointment of the local Returning Officer and Electoral Registration Officer for Blaenau Gwent.

2. Scope and Background

At the Special Council meeting on 17th February 2022, the Head of Organisational Development presented a report proposing arrangements as a consequence of the former Managing Director leaving the Council to take up the role of Ombudsman. As part of the report, it was proposed and accepted that the role of Returning Officer/Electoral Registration Officer be temporarily designated to the Head of Legal and Corporate Compliance who had previous experience in acting as the Returning Officer/Electoral Registration Officer. The Chief Officer Resources was to continue in the role of Deputy Returning Officer/Electoral Registration Officer. This was an interim measure until such time as the substantive role of Chief Executive was filled. However, it has not yet been possible to recruit to the role of Chief Executive and there are two national Elections due to take place in 2024, namely, the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) in May 2024 and a UK General Election, date vet unknown but must be held before January 2025. In terms of the Returning Officer/ERO roles, certainty is therefore required for the purposes of the statutory designation.

3. **Options for Recommendation**

3.1 **Option 1**:

Council confirms the appointment of the Head of Legal & Corporate Compliance to act as the Returning Officer & Electoral Registration Officer for Blaenau Gwent, until such time as the designation is reviewed.

Option 2:

Council considers an alternative appointment.

4. Evidence of how this topic supports the achievement of the Corporate Plan / Statutory Responsibilities / Blaenau Gwent Well-being Plan
There is a statutory duty to appoint a local Returning Officer and Electoral Registration officer.

5. Implications Against Each Option

If a Returning Officer/ERO is not appointed there is a risk of non-compliance with legislation.
